# Return to site – April 26<sup>th</sup>



- Parent Letter sent through L4L Connect/Parent Square with details
- Limited onsite staff schedule
- Students must schedule an onsite appointment with their teacher (no walk-ins)
- Students will only able to be onsite during a specific block period (1.5 hr in length) and will then be dismissed to go home
- All students must wear a mask and maintain 6 ft social distancing
- Students may continue with distance learning until June 30<sup>th</sup> with all students returning for onsite instruction on July 1<sup>st</sup>
